We are putting the science of eyewitness memory and international development studies into conversation to develop new approaches for collecting memory evidence in low resource environments, such as in Low and Middle Income Countries and in conflict settings, where the criminal justice infrastructure and other necessary resources are minimal for collecting testimony and statements from witnesses and victims.

- The development of science-based investigative interviewing tools for use by police investigators around the world
- Innovating procedures for increased criminal identification accuracy
- Crime linkage analysis for solving and prioritising sexual violence cases
- Using data to identify barriers to successful sexual violence case prosecutions
- Testing the effects of alcohol on rape victim memory
- The use of technology in the documentation of sexual violence
- Developing new training toolkits for rape survivors' networks, criminal investigators, NGOs and CSO
- Building capacity of survivors communities, NGOs and CSOs to conduct research and advocate for social, policy and practice change
